Статия в списание

Задължително се посочват име на автор, година на издаване, заглавие на статия, име на списание (наклонен шрифт), годишен том (удебелен шрифт), номер на брой (в скоби), страници (по номера, разделени с дълго тире).

Такъв източник се цитира в основния текст като (Zlateva 2019). Ако има нужда да се посочи и конкретна страница (напр. стр. 690), тя се посочва по следния начин: (Zlateva 2019, 690).

Ако цитираната литература е на кирилица, то се правят два аналогични параграфа – на кирилица и на латиница:

Статия в онлайн периодично издание

Източникът на текста (лесно достъпен уеб адрес или DOI номер) следва да бъде поставен в края на цитирания източник.

Обърнете внимание, че:

когато статията е публикувана в списание, с наклонен шрифт се изписва названието на списанието;

списание „Обучение по природни науки и върхови технологии“ на английски език се цитира като *Natural Science and Advanced Technology Education*;

при цитирането на списание „Обучение по природни науки и върхови технологии“ или съответно *Natural Science and Advanced Technology Education* е задължително указването както на годишния том, така и на номера/броя, в който се намира цитираната статия.

Ако източникът е на български език, но е представен във вторичен литературен източник, например в Web of Science, източникът трябва да се появи в списъка на литературата по следния начин:

Когато авторите на дадена статия са повече от трима, допустимо е в списъка с източниците авторският състав да бъде описан в съкратен вариант с използване на съкр. et al., както следва:

Nichols, P., Twing, J., Mueller, C.D. & O'Malley, K., 2010. Standard-setting methods as measurement processes. *Educational Measurement: Issues & Practice*. **29**(1), 14 – 24.

или като:

Такъв източник се посочва в основния текст като (Nichols, Twing, Mueller & O'Malley 2010) или като (Nichols et al. 2010) – в зависимост от начина на записване в списъка с цитирана литература.

#### Книги

При книгите, за разлика от статиите на списанията, с наклонен шрифт се пише заглавието на книгата. Авторът на ръкописа посочва също името на града и на издателя на книгата.

#### Книги/сборници с редактор

Както е посочено в примера по-долу, само заглавието на цитираната книга/сборник се дава с наклонен шрифт. След града/името на издателя се посочват цитираните страници.

#### **Коректури**

(12) Преди отпечатване на одобрените ръкописи, авторите получават коректури на своите статии, които трябва да върнат в редакцията в срок от една седмица. Не се допускат значими промени в текста на този етап.

#### **Отпечатьци**

(13) Публикуването се обявява на авторите с писмо, което съдържа .pdf файл на статията. Правата върху публикувания текст са собственост на списанието. Полученият .pdf файл не следва да се разпространява свободно, включително и чрез академични и социални мрежи за споделяне на резултати от научни изследвания (напр. ResearchGate.net и Academia.edu).

(14) В академични и социални мрежи за споделяне на резултати от научни изследвания авторът споделя ръкописа във варианта, в който е подаден първоначално към списанието за разглеждане. Ако текстът бъде приет, след публикуването му авторът добавя в споделения ръкопис име, годишен том и брой на списанието, в който е отпечатан.

#### **Заключителни думи**

(15) Публикуването на представените материали се определя от препоръките на рецензентите и не означава непременно съгласие на редакцията със застъпването от авторите гледища. Редакторите могат да извършват технически редакции на ръкописите, когато това е необходимо, без да променят смисъла на изказаните тези.

(16) Публикуването в това списание е безплатно както за авторите, така и за техните научни или учебни организации, като статията става достъпна:

– пълнотекстово – за абонатите на списанието;

– като метаданни (заглавие, резюме, ключови думи, визитка на автор) – за всички читатели.

(17) При желание от страна на автора (или представляваната от него институция) статията да бъде достъпна пълнотекстово за всички читатели, списанието може да осигури такава възможност чрез онлайн страницата си – след заплащане на защитна такса, отразяваща направените по статията разходи.

## **AUTHOR'S GUIDELINES**

The Author's Guidelines are prepared following the Journal's policy to present to the maximum extent all published manuscripts in international scientific databases. The Guidelines are in accordance with BDS ISO 690-2011 standard.

### **Forewords**

*Natural Science and Advanced Technology Education Journal* considers manuscripts submitted solely to it.

When sending a manuscript to the Journal, the Author must declare that the manuscript is not already submitted or under consideration for publication elsewhere.

By submitting manuscript, the Author agrees to follow the Guidelines, requirements and ethical principles for scientific research publishing. The latter's violation will be considered a refusal of cooperation between the Author and the Journal in future.

Manuscripts that do not correspond to the journal's scope or manuscripts that are not prepared according to the Guidelines will be rejected without going through blind peer review's procedure.

Manuscripts should be submitted for consideration electronically as e-mail attachments to [science@azbuki.bg](mailto:science@azbuki.bg). It is also acceptable to send the manuscript, together with the appendixes on a CD at the following ground address: 125, Tzarigradsko Shose Blvd., bl. 5, 1113 Sofia, Bulgaria.

Manuscripts must report original research ideas and results.

Manuscripts should be prepared by using a standard word processing program. All appendixes in the form of graphs, tables or illustrations should be suitable for reading and editing with programs commonly used for such purposes.

The Journal does not encourage the detailed presentation of commonly known theoretical concepts available in other sources. The Journal reserves the right not to publish manuscripts in which the similarity level exceeds 20%.

Citation of literature that is not relevant to the manuscript's topic, or is not cited in the text, is not acceptable. Self-citations (i.e. citations of previous publications of the authors of the manuscript) should be substantiated and should not exceed 15% of the total number of cited sources.

The Author should have a personal scientific identifier (e.g. in Researcher ID/Publons, Scopus, ORCID or Russian Science Citation Index) that presents author's activities and manuscripts in front of the international scientific society. The Author's scientific ID should be written in the author's business card.

Decision upon publishing the manuscript or not will be taken according to the recommendations of independent and anonymous reviewers.

Manuscript should be deemed accepted for publication when the author receives a letter of confirmation within three months, starting from the manuscript submission date. In case

there are different reviewers' recommendations and arbiter is invited, the period could be extended to up to six months. The mentioned period does not include the time that authors need to fulfill the reviewers' recommendations.

### **Manuscript preparation**

#### **General guidelines**

(1) Manuscripts may be submitted in Bulgarian or English, depending on the author's opinion or the reviewers' recommendation.

(2) Recommended manuscript size – up to 25,000 characters for research article and up to 15,000 characters for a book review (along with the spacing between words). There are no text formatting requirements for font type and size.

(3) It is not recommended to specifically format the text itself with regard to tabs, bullets and other similar symbols. Tabs should be used for table layout only.

(4) Manuscripts should be compiled in the following order: title of the paper (without any abbreviations); names of the authors with their scientific degree, academic position and institution; abstract outlining the novelty and results of the study; 3 – 6 keywords; full text; acknowledgments (if any); appendixes (as appropriate); notes; references; full business card of the author(s) – academic position, affiliation, personal ID in scientific databases; postal address, e-mail address.

(5) The abstract should indicate the research goal and methodology, and to outline the research novelty and results. The abstract should correspond to the title, keywords and main text of the study. Recommended abstract volume – 100 – 150 words.

(6) Figures (Illustrations) and their captions should be presented simultaneously with the text and separately in a new file. If the figure's volume is not suitable for inserting, its position should be indicated in the text clearly – Fig. 1, Fig. 2, etc.

(7) Tables and their captions should be presented simultaneously with the text and separately in a new file. If the table's volume is not suitable for inserting, its position should be indicated in the text clearly – Table 1, Table 2, etc. Tables are used for presenting quantities or variables. Plain text tables are not encouraged as they cause troubles in the pre-print and printing process.

### **Notes and References**

(8) Acknowledgments, cited archival sources and notes at the end of the text are written only in the language of the main text of the manuscript.

(9) The references should be cited in Roman script. If there are sources in Cyrillic script, they (authors, titles and sources) should be presented in Roman script – with translation or by transliteration.

(10) The list of references should include sources that can be checked easily by the referees and by the readers as well. The marginal sources without broad visibility should not be included in the list of references. Nevertheless, if such sources are necessary to be cited, they should appear in the list of notes, together with additional explanations or marginal sources for which it is considered that their presence in the main text would burden it unnecessarily. The position of notes within the text should be marked by Arabic numerals as superscripts.

(11) The cited literature should be presented in the list of references in accordance with BDS ISO 690-2011 standard (Harvard System).

**Some examples:**

Journal article: The reference includes: author's name, year of publication, article's title, journal's name (in *Italics*), volume (in **Bold**), issue (in brackets), pages.

Such a source is cited in the text as: (Zlateva 2019). If it is necessary to indicate a specific page (e.g. p. 690), it is indicated as follows: (Zlateva 2019, 690).

Online periodicals article:

The article source (accessible web address or DOI) should be placed at the end of the cited source.

Have in mind, that:

- When the article is published in a journal, the journal name is written in *italics*.
- When citing, it is necessary to indicate the annual volume and the issue of the journal.

If the source is in a language, different that the body text one, then the original language should be pointed in brackets at the end.

When there are more than three authors, the usage of the abbreviation et al. is also acceptable, as follows:

Nichols, P., Twing, J., Mueller, C.D. & O'Malley, K., 2010. Standard-setting methods as measurement processes. *Educational Measurement: Issues & Practice*. **29**(1), 14 – 24.

or as:

Nichols, P., et al., 2010. Standard-setting methods as measurement processes. *Educational Measurement: Issues & Practice*. **29**(1), 14 – 24.

Such source is cited in the text as: (Nichols, Twing, Mueller & O'Malley 2010), or as (Nichols et al. 2010) – depending on the way it is stated in the reference list.

Books

In books, the title of the book is written in *italics*. The author of the manuscript also mentions the city and the publisher of the book.

Merion, D.B., 1975. *Physics and physical world*. Moskva: Mir.

Edited Books

As shown in the example below, only the title of the cited book / collection is given in *italics*. The quoted pages are indicated after the city / publisher's name.

Carman, T., 2005. On the Inescapability of Phenomenology. In: D.W. Smith & A. L. Thomasson (Eds.). *Phenomenology and Philosophy of Mind*. Oxford: Clarendon Press. 67 – 89.

### Proofs

(12) Before publishing the authors will have the opportunity to check the proof of their paper. The proof should be corrected and returned to the Editor within a week. Major alterations to the text cannot be accepted.

### Reprints

(13) The article publication is announced to the authors with an email containing a .pdf file of the article. The copyrights of the published article are journal's property. The final .pdf file sent to the author should not be freely distributed; the latter includes academic and social networking sites (e.g. ResearchGate.net and Academia.edu).

(14) The authors reserve their right to share the manuscript in such academic and social networking sites in the form it was originally submitted to the journal. After publication, the author can additionally state in a note the volume and journal issue.

### Final words

(15) The acceptance of the submitted manuscripts for publication depends strongly on the reviewers' recommendations. The publishing of the paper does not mean that the editors are in agreement with the points of view advocated by the authors. The editors reserve the right to edit manuscripts when necessary.

(16) There are no charges to individuals or institutions for publication in this journal. The published articles are:

- fully available for subscribers of the journal;
- as metadata (title, abstract, keywords, author's business card) – for all readers.

(17) If the author (or the institution he represents) wishes to enable the article in full text for all readers, the journal can provide such an opportunity through its online page – after paying a royalty fee, reflecting the expenses made for article processing.
